Tragedy Befalls Antioch Officer

On Monday, March 9, 2009, a tragedy befell a member of the Antioch Police Officers' Association. Six year Antioch Police veteran, James Vincent, was involved in a fiery crash while pursuing a wanted parolee driving a stolen vehicle. Fortunately, James survived the crash and was pulled from the wreckage before the fire could consume him. However, the impact of the crash was so great that, despite being seat belted, Officer Vincent suffered a spinal cord injury that has left him paralyzed from his waist down.

James is facing comprehensive and lengthy physical therapy and significant amounts of uncovered expenses, including modifications for wheelchair access to his home, vehicle, etc.

To ensure that James get all the care, equipment and necessities he needs, the Antioch Police Officers' Association has
